

create a tailor-made home from top to bottom. The intention was to move the master bedroom, originally at the front of the house, to the rear, and create a new en-suite bathroom and dressing room, plus two guest rooms at the front of the house. A loft extension would provide the children's bedrooms, playroom and bathroom.

As the house is in a conservation area, compromises to the original designs for the loft extension had to be made before building work finally began in spring 2010.
